## CHANGING LIVES WITH KINDNESS - VOLUNTEERS

### Feral Cat Volunteer

Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) is the humane approach to addressing community cat populations. It saves cats' lives and is effective. TNR improves the lives of cats, addresses community concerns, reduces complaints about cats, and stops the breeding cycle. Help QAS improve the co-existence between outdoor cats and humans in our shared environment.

#### TRAP TEAM

- Use humane traps to help us trap feral cats at designated colonies on specific days & times.

#### OVERNIGHT HOUSING

- If you have a spare room or climate-controlled garage space away from people, other animals, or loud noises, you can house the caged feral cats overnight until they can be transported to the clinic or back to the release site. Unfortunately, we do not have sufficient space at the shelter.

#### TRANSPORT/RETURN

- If you have an SUV or other type of enclosed back seat (no open truck beds or trunks, please), help transport cats to and from the Spay/Neuter Clinic or their overnight housing site.

#### CAT COLONY CARE

- Provide food and water for the cats outside, especially for the first few weeks after surgery, so they remain healthy during the healing process.
